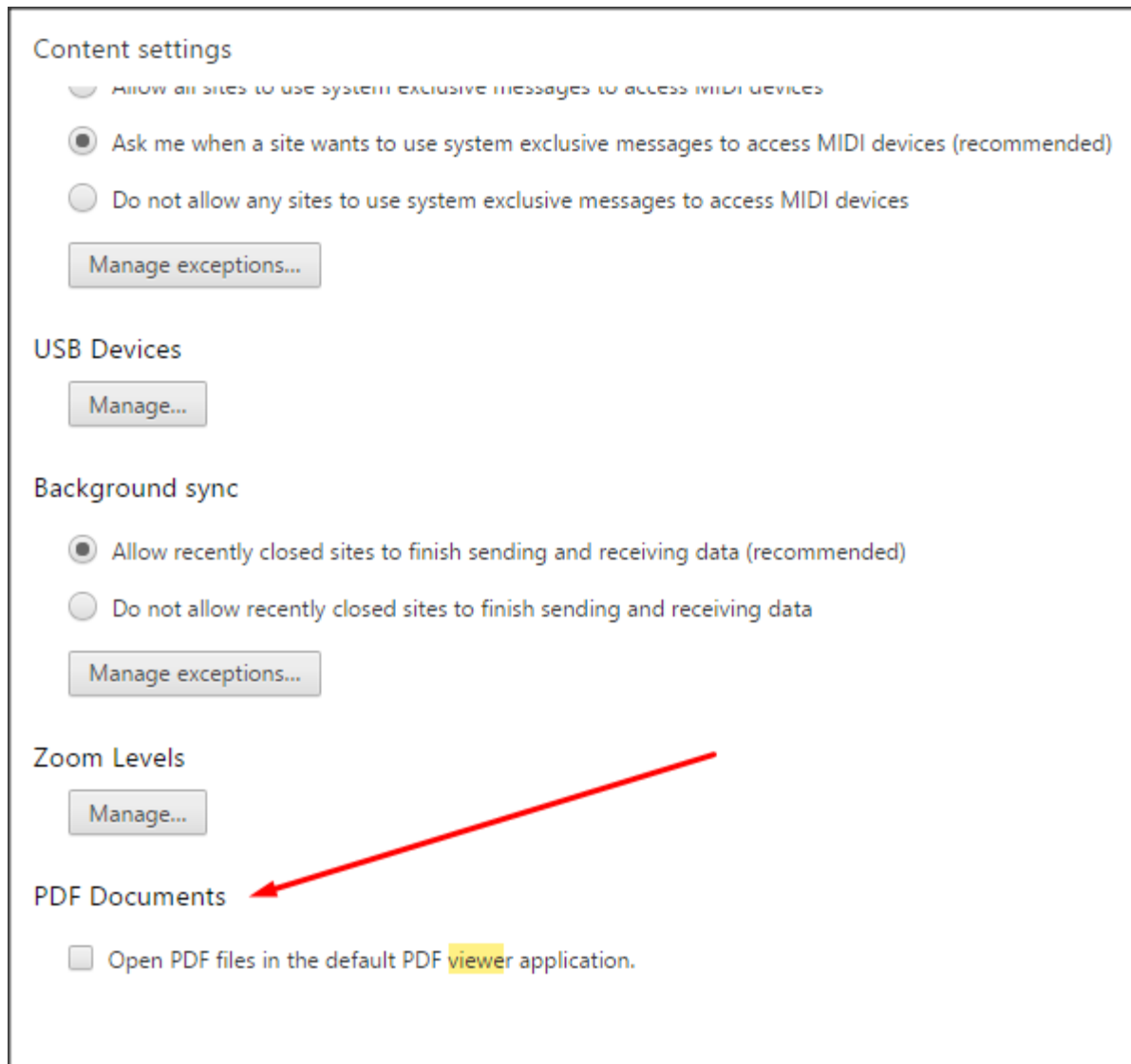


You can administer Chrome's built-in components including Chrome's PDF Viewer by clicking on the Settings option, the three vertical dots ( : ) on the top, right-hand portion of your Google Chrome window, then choose Settings then Show advanced settings then under Privacy, click on the button Content settings and the following windows will open. Scroll all the way to the bottom and under PDF Documents check the box. This will disable Chrome's PDF Viewer.
